Queensland Music Festivals Wins Prestigious *Best Music Tourism Initiative* at Music Cities Awards in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia

December 9th, 2024 - Brisbane, Queensland — Queensland Music Festivals (QMF) has been awarded the **Best Music Tourism Initiative** at the internationally renowned **Music Cities Awards** for their groundbreaking project, **Between the Tides**. The award was announced at a ceremony in Riyadh, recognising QMF's exceptional efforts in promoting cultural tourism through immersive and sustainable music experiences.

The accolade underscores QMF's ability to transform Queensland's diverse landscapes into world-class cultural destinations, highlighting the state's rich heritage and natural beauty. By presenting **Between the Tides** at Cape Hillsborough National Park—on Native Title land in collaboration with the Yuwi People and Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service (QPWS)—QMF delivered an unforgettable celebration of First Nations culture and music.

Daryl Raven, CEO of QMF, expressed great pride in receiving this global recognition:

"This award highlights the transformative power of music to unite people with the stories and spirit of place. **Between The Tides 2023** seamlessly wove together the ancient wisdom of the Yuwi People, the natural beauty Cape Hillsborough National Park, and the universal language of music to create an experience that deeply touched everyone involved. We are incredibly grateful to our partners, including the Queensland State Government, and Mackay Regional Council including Mayor Greg Williamson, for their unwavering support, and to the Yuwi People for their generosity in sharing their culture and helping us honour their remarkable Country. Together, we are proud to champion Queensland as a global leader in regenerative tourism and cultural sustainability."

This milestone comes on the heels of **Between the Tides winning silver** at this year's Queensland Tourism Awards, further solidifying QMF's reputation as a pioneer in eco-conscious and culturally respectful tourism.

Arts Minister John-Paul Langbroek congratulated QMF on winning the Music Cities Awards' Best Music Tourism Initiative for its 2023 Between the Tides event.

"The Queensland Government is committed to backing our music industry with a \$20 million, three-year investment into music trails that showcase diverse parts of Queensland.

QMF's approach prioritises sustainability, from eco-friendly event practices to authentic collaborations with traditional owners, ensuring that their events leave a positive impact on both people and place. **Between the Tides** will be back in 2025 with artist, locations, and date announcements due to take place in January 2025.
