 - Contributed \$149,269 in direct and incremental expenditure to Queensland's economy, with \$78,247 benefitting the Mackay region directly.
- Award-Winning Recognition **Between the Tides** 2023 received:
 - Silver in the Cultural Tourism category at the Queensland Tourism Awards 2024.
 - The title of Best Music Tourism Initiative at the Global Music Cities Awards in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia 2024

Taking place between two tidal movements, this unique experience is guided by the custodians of the Yuwi Nation, offering a profound connection to the land. Witness the timeless expressions of Country—both ancient and contemporary—brought to life through captivating performances by renowned artists, Xavier Rudd, Kee'ahn and Keely who honour this ever-changing landscape. Each evening begins at the Gathering Space in the parklands, where visitors can enjoy live music, interactive workshops in weaving, ochre painting, and woodwork, as well as savour locally crafted food, beverages, arts, and crafts. As dusk falls, Yuwibara hosts will lead guests onto the delicate sands for an unforgettable concert under the stars.
