

SUBLIME CHAMBER PERFORMANCES SHOWCASE THE NEXT GENERATION OF STELLAR MUSICIANS

This year, Queensland Music Festival (QMF) is bringing a series of captivating chamber performances to the State Library of Queensland's stunning riverside Red Box, on 17, 24 and 31 July 2015.

The three Twilight in the Red Box concerts are dedicated to supporting Queensland's next generation of musicians, and are curated by cellist Patrick Murphy from The University of Queensland (UQ).

Performances will feature the UQ Chamber Choir, directed by Graeme Morton; the Pulse Chamber Orchestra, directed by Patrick Murphy; and a solo cello recital by Murphy himself.

QMF Artistic Director James Morrison said QMF is passionate about supporting the next generation of young musicians.

"This year's Twilight in the Red Box will give emerging classic musicians from The University of Queensland an opportunity to perform professionally," Mr Morrison said.

"It is so important for young musicians to have the opportunity to work with and learn from talented musicians like Patrick Murphy and Graeme Morton, to perform in venues in front of audiences, and to gather the confidence they need to take the music industry by storm.

"The State Library's Red Box is such a beautiful, intimate venue with unique views of the Brisbane River, and combined with the sublime sounds these musicians will create, these concerts will take your breath away."

Twilight in the Red Box is presented by QMF, Brisbane City Council and The University of Queensland, and is proudly supported by the State Library of Queensland and ABC 612 Brisbane.
